## FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND OTHER SUPPORT FOR DISADVANTAGED PUPILS - HERE'S WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Department for Education

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after I April 2018 your household earnings must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

## How long will it take to process the claim?

We aim to process applications within 5-10 working days.

Once we have determined the outcome of the application we will advise the school (normally by phone) and you will be issued with a letter.

Schools will ensure this information is treated in the strictest confidence and handled sensitively.
