Rail and Road Safety



Dear student.

For those of you receiving your results this summer we know you might have questions about how your results are determined, results day, confirming offers and Clearing. Such as, what are your options on results day? What happens if you change your mind about your choices?

Here are a few things to remember:

- Your work is marked and graded by expert examiners. They do not know your name, which school or college you attended, or where in the country you live.
 Ofqual makes sure that the rules are the same for all students taking the same qualification.
- All students are assessed on the same basis and your grade is determined solely
 on your work. Whatever your results, you can be confident that it's no harder or
 easier to achieve a particular grade in the same subject no matter which exam
 board's GCSE or A level qualification you took.
