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On Friday 14 October Oddballs came into school to speak to students about physical health. The OddBalls Foundation was founded in December 2015 to raise awareness of Testicular Cancer. Through the Foundation they hope to make a difference to male health around the world. Their team of 40 University Ambassadors are now delivering over 500 talks a year and reaching over 100,000 people! The University Ambassador Programme has become one of the most popular and competitive ambassador schemes for university students. Gem visited OACF in October to talk to our students about this very important subject. Cancer of the testicle is 1 of the less common cancers, and tends to mostly affect men between 15 and 49 years of age. Cancer is the second-leading cause of death worldwide and 10 million people die from cancer every year. Having the talk by Oddball foundation can raise awareness and improve the life chances of all our students and community.

Welcome to the first of our monthly news updates for the continued expansion programme at Outwood Academy City Fields. Wakefield-based Morgan Sindall Construction have been awarded the contract via the Scape framework to deliver the new facilities, which will increase the school's Published Admission Number from 150 to 210.

Construction works

The new scheme will be built on the school grounds, with the two-storey building connecting to the existing via a link bridge. It will be accessed during the build phase from an entrance to the rear of the school on Windhill Road.

Our construction works are now underway and include the following:

- · Concrete foundations and slab
- Steel frame
- Brickwork façade
- · Link Bridge connecting to existing school
- Land drainage
